Assolve il suo mandato lungo l'intero arco di una carriera ormai quasi cinquantennale e attraversa le trasformazioni della società, del costume e della moda della seconda metà del Novecento senza mai rinunciare al proprio sguardo sul mondo, algido e glamour fino all'ottusità. A seguito di uno dei suoi numerosi viaggi attraverso l'Europa, Edmondo De Amicis si prende il tempo di riportare la sua esperienza in uno dei paesi la cui storia è strettamente legata a quella italiana: la Spagna. Secoli di dominazioni, conquiste, ma anche di influenze reciproche e scambi culturali che risalgono fino ai tempi dei Romani hanno unito i destini, le lingue, e le tradizioni di questi due paesi. De Amicis, in questo suo reportage fatto di descrizioni e spunti riflessivi, dipinge la Spagna di oltre cento anni fa con maestria e acume, lasciando ai posteri una testimonianza sincera delle sue impressioni. Edmondo De Amicis (1846-1908) è stato uno scrittore italiano, tra i più importanti nel panorama nazionale e internazionale. La sua opera "Cuore" è uno dei libri per ragazzi più letti e influenti della storia della letteratura, che lo ha reso una figura importantissima per lo sviluppo di una coscienza letteraria nazionale.

Originally published in 1963, and today considered a landmark in twentieth century Italian literature, Luigi Meneghello's Deliver Us is the memoir, not of an extraordinary childhood, but of the very ordinary one the author shared with most of his generation, when Italy was a rural country under the twin authorities of Church and Fascism. His boyhood begins in 1922, the year of Mussolini's March on Rome, and ends when Meneghello, 21, goes up into the hills to join the partisans. Called a romanzo—a story, although not a novel, as that term usually suggests—the book is a genre all of its own that mixes personal and collective memory, amateur ethnography, and reflections on language. Meneghello's sharp insights and narrative skill come together in an original meditation on how words, people, places, and things shape thought itself. Only loosely chronological, Deliver Us proceeds by themes—childhood games, Fascist symbols, religious precepts, and the rites of poverty, of death, of eros, and of love. Meneghello's ironic musings and profoundly honest recollections make an utterly un sentimental human comedy of that was the whole world to his dawning consciousness.
