More info from the American Heart Association. The American Heart Association announced its newest CPR recommendations on October 16 th, 2015. The new CPR guidelines are based on the latest scientific data from the previous 5 years. The new update has placed limits on how fast and deep chest compressions should be performed.

CPR Steps | Perform CPR | Red Cross

Give two breaths after every 30 chest compressions. If two people are conducting CPR, give two breaths after every 15 chest compressions. Perform CPR for about two minutes before calling for help unless someone else can make the call while you attend to the infant. Continue CPR until you see signs of life or until medical personnel arrive.

Tips for Proper CPR Technique in Adults

High-quality CPR at a rate of 100-120 chest compressions per minute must be started immediately to keep oxygenated blood flowing to their brain. However, when someone experiences sudden cardiac arrest, the only thing that will set their heart back into a normal rhythm is the shock from a defibrillator.

The American Heart Association Changes Their Guidelines ...

In 2016, the American Heart Association (AHA) published a paper in the scientific journal Circulation that included guidelines for Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Emergency Cardiovascular Care (ECC). Current research still affirms that resuscitation, when performed perfectly, increases the survival rate for hospital discharge.
